#### I. PRELIMINARIES:

- 1.1 TM called the meeting of the Board of Water Commissioners to order at 7:10 PM at 540 Main St and by Zoom.
- 1.2 TM announced that the meeting is being recorded on Zoom.
- 1.3 Roll call showed members present: Todd Melanson (TM)-Chairman, Nathan Mattila (NM)-Vice Chairman. Roll call showed citizens present: David Vigeant (DV)-Water Superintendent, Chaz Sexton Diranian (CSD)-Board of Selectmen, James Sartell-Townsend Police Department. Christopher Jones was absent.
- 1.4 Chairman's additions or deletions.
  - 1.4.1 TM discussed the fire in the Vinton Pond area. The Fire Department has been using the hydrant off Jonathan Ln and it has been causing problems for residents because of the reversal of flow.

    1.4.2 Townsend is now in a level 2 drought. TM suggested putting a plan in place to restrict water usage and us the TPD to help enforce it. CSD emphasized the importance of having all response departments work together and send the same message. NM voiced that the best form of communication is using the Facebook groups for the town. TM requested that a post regarding conservation be posted on the department website and Facebook as well as using the CodeRed program and the highway signs to get word across about the restriction. James Sartell suggested having a press release in local papers.
- 1.5 Approve Meeting Minutes of June 6, 2022. NM motioned to approve the meeting minutes of June 6, 2022. TM seconded. Unanimous vote.
- 1.6 Review correspondence. Public Comments. Resident at 13 Proctor Rd submitted a letter to the commissioners. He is upset about the quality of his water and the response he received when he contacted the department. TM explained that we are not able to resolve this in the way the resident would like due to not having enough water in the system. Maureen Giacobbe from 10 Birch Lane also has water quality issues.

#### V. LIASON UPDATES AND REPORTS-VOTES MAY BE TAKEN:

5.1 CSD reminded the Commissioners about the upcoming joint meeting on July 13th with the Selectmen and the Board of Health.

The Board of Selectmen has received complaints about the High School watering during the restricted hours. TM explained that the school is exempt from the regulations due to health and safety reasons, and we cannot enforce the department's restrictions on them. TM requested that DV reach out to the school to see if they are aware of best practices for the field and operating within the restrictions.

#### VI. SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATES AND REPORTS-VOTES MAY BE TAKEN:

- 6.1 Update/Discuss Main Street Well. DV explained that the electric work will be completed on Wednesday, then the well will be run to waste to allow for testing. The line has been tested, so the well can be turned on once the tests come back.
- 6.2 Update/Discuss 169 Main St and Greely Rd. DV reported that the project is scheduled to start next week.
- 6.3 Update/Discuss PFAS. DV announced that the results at Witches Brook 2 is under 10ppt for the second time in a row. UMASS will be coming back to Harbor Trace for their testing of at-home filtration systems.
- 6.4 Update/Discuss Harbor Trace Treatment Plant. DV reported that the perk test is taking place tomorrow. DV included the tentative floor plans in the meeting packet, there may be minor changes involved. TM said that there is a new company that may be able to save money by having a smaller vessel using newer, better technology. TM will send the information to DV> DV also noted that the loan for the State Revolving Find needs to be applied for by October 14, 2022.
- 6.5 Update/Discuss 12 South St-Deluxe. DV noted that Deluxe is in the permitting phase and the department is waiting to hear back.
- 6.6 Update/Discuss Highland St. DV explained that #50 is completed. The people that had the most problems are now done. #46 will have the driveway repaired this week. A hydrant will be added to the 16" line and the 6" will be abandoned.

6.7 Update/Discuss generators at Main Street and Cross Street Stations. The existing generators cannot be reused. Plans are being worked on for new ones.

When my filters get clogged or when we can smell bacteria in water at downstairs bathroom, I would call Water to please flush out hydrant. This time I sent an email to dvigent@townsend water.org. In past the Water Department would come and flush the stuff out. On May 20, 2022 a lot of black silt was flushed out. What it is I have no idea.

I sent an email to same email as above and then called. His response, 'NO, we are not flushing and hung up."

This situation needs to be corrected. Just imagine all this material entering my water heater, washing machine, my dryer and refrigerator and the cost of filters. Can I deduct cost of filters from water bill?

I am going to test this water when it starts to smell again to see what is being passed on to this family

Do we drink this dirty water, no.


In 2 weeks my line water filter is brown/black. Pleaseeeeee flush hydrate out front. This is getting expensive. (2 WEEKS)


LI:



I would like to use the scale above for her to create a fair workplace in the past each worker got a Raise of \$2.00 per hour per license. We are no longer able to do that due in part to the Collins report. And I will say this I have heard that she is clerical she does not deserve it. I have 9 sisters and have raised 2 daughters who I have told they can be anything they like and I find comments like that very offensive. Mistie holds one of the new hybrid positions and has done everything asked of here to include going into the field when needed and checking Scada as well as turning wells on and off as part of her duties. I would like very much for here to be paid as a water operator and receive compensation as such. I want to make this clear the Water Department has no clerical positions especially with the immediate building of the water treatment plant. Please call or write back the unions position or approval/ What is written above is not only for New Workers but also for someone like Mistie to make sure they are being treated fairly.

RE: PFAS Cost Recovery Program

I did get some clarification from DEP over the language that appeared in the SRF IUP which Tom was referencing, here is the state's response.

The language on page 9 of the 2022 DWSRF IUP (https://www.mass.gov/doc/2022-final-drinking-water-intended-useplan/download) means that the state is reserving its rights to pursue claims against PFAS manufacturers for costs incurred by the state. This language is not intended to limit the ability of municipalities to pursue claims against PFAS

manufacturers for costs they have incurred, such as SRF loan repayment. The state will pursue cost recovery for principal forgiveness directly from the PFAS manufacturers and other related potentially liable parties, not from municipalities.




